Some Thoughts about Love

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

We are all familiar with the commandment to love God and our neighbor and we, as a society, seem to be making a better effort at being sensitive to the needs and wants of others, sensitivity to the condition under which others live... at least, when they agree with us.

But...what about that commandment to love God? When our Lord responds to the scribe's question about the greatest commandment, it is interesting that He answers by listing two commandments. We are meant to understand that loving God and neighbor are inextricably linked. Elsewhere our Lord explain that one cannot say he or she loves the Lord but despise his or her neighbor. From my perspective, I think the vast majority of us have well learned this lesson. Bear minimum, we all know that we should love our neighbor and treat that person with respect; however, I think we can fall into the danger of entirely reducing the love of God to the love of neighbor so much so that God ends up out of the picture.

The point is this: the reason we can love God in our neighbor is that God created that other person in His image and likeness; however, we don't only love God through an instrument. For example, a man may demonstrate his love for his wife by being a good father to their children, but I would guess that he also makes sure never to forget their wedding anniversary and vice versa. Similarly, we should ask ourselves: "How do I love God in Himself?" The answer has a number of facets, but the most important one and the one at the center of all the others is through Sunday worship and allowing the Lord to give Himself to you in the Eucharist. The interesting truth is that we love someone not only by giving ourselves to that other but also by allowing them to give themselves to us. When we receive the Eucharist, we allow our Lord to love us by giving Himself to us. He desires to give Himself and we love Him by being receptive to Him.

As this liturgical year comes to an end in several weeks, let us ask ourselves: "Am I allowing our Lord to give Himself to me?"

May Almighty bless you and keep you.




